Dr. Boss is Professor Emeritus at the University of Minnesota and a family therapist in private practice. As a scientist-practitioner, she is the principal theorist in the study of ambiguous loss, a term she coined in the 1970s to define a loss that has no physical evidence of death or certainty that the person will come back or return to the way they used to be.

Dr. Boss is a Fellow in the American Psychological Association and American Association of Marriage and Family Therapy and a former president of the National Council on Family Relations.
